Materials:

1 black seed bead
2 shuttles
size 30 ecru thread
size 30 brown thread

Abbreviations:

slt = shoelace trick
- = picot
+ = join
R = ring
SSSR = single shuttle split ring

CH = chain
ss = switch shuttles
SH1 = Shuttle 1
RW = reverse work
DNRW = do not reverse work

SH1:

Clover R1 12 - 6 - 6
R2 6 + 10 - 6
R3 6 + 4 - 4 - 6 slt
CH 8 slt
R 4 + 4 - 4 - 4 slt
CH 10 slt
R 4 + 4 - 2 (push up bead) 2 slt
CH 5 slt RW
CH 5 + (to last p) ss 4

SH2

R 4+ (to last p) 4 slt
CH 8 slt
R 12 + 8 - 4 slt
CH 30 slt
R 4 + (to p between R1 & R2) 4 slt
Ch 3 - 2 + (to 1st p of R1) ss

SH1:

Upper tail

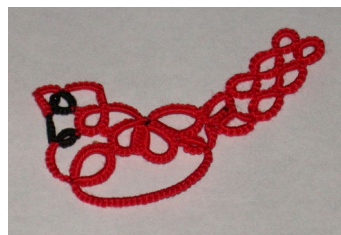
SSSR 6
SSSR 6
R 9 - 3, work back down the
SSSR's with 3 - 3 on each

Under tail

SSSR 3 + (to p on prev. SSSR) 3
SSSR 3 + (to p on prev. SSSR) 3
R 9 - 3, work back along the
SSSR's with 6 ds on each.
Cut, tie, hide ends.
